Cornell Method

Method:

- 1 **Record** notes from lecture/reading (in main column).
- 2 **Recal**l after lecture, in LH column, note key/cue words, phrases, questions.
- 3 Recite cover main column &, using 'Recall' keywords and questions as prompts, recite main facts and ideas in own words.
- 4 **Reflect** think over, ask questions.
- 5 **Review** write summary at the bottom review each week; use at exam time.
